Smart Safety Tips

But here are some suggestions that can help reduce the chance.

- Leaving valuables in sight can tempt a would-be thief. Remove GPS devices, cell phones, presents, purses or wallets and even loose change or place them in the trunk. Also, keep these kinds of items from being seen through windows in your home.
- Locks work only if they are being used. Keep the doors to your car and home locked at all times, even when you are inside.
- Using caution is your best protection. Be observant of everyone and everything around you. Have your keys out and ready to unlock your car before you come out of your home or any building. Before getting into your car, look inside and around your car.
- Uncollected mail and/or newspapers will alert someone you are not at home. Ask your neighbors to assist you in collecting mail and newspapers or have your mail held at the post office and your newspaper stopped until you return.
- Would-be criminals prefer not to be seen. When going out at night, park only in well lit areas. Report immediately to management any lights that are not working in the community.

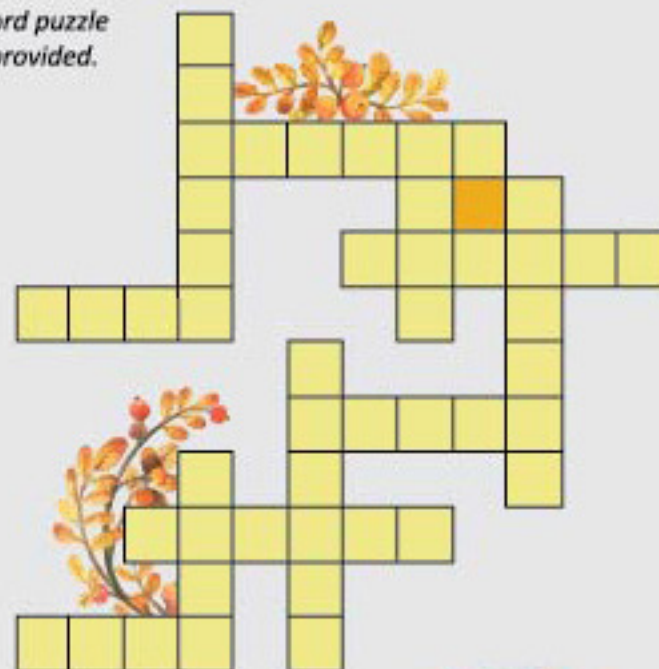

PUMPKIN SHEET CAKE

2 cups sugar
1 cup vegetable oil
2 cups flour (not self-rising)
1 tsp. soda
2 tsp. cinnamon
1 cup nuts – chopped (optional)

4 eggs
2 cups pumpkin
1/2 tsp. salt
2 tsp. baking powder
1 tsp. nutmeg



BUTTERCREAM ICING

3 & 3/4 cups of powdered sugar
3 – 4 tbs. milk
Dash cinnamon
1/2 cup butter (softened)
1 tsp. vanilla

Heat oven to 350 degrees. In large mixing bowl combine all cake ingredients together. Mix until all ingredients are completely combined. Lightly grease bottom and sides of 10x15 jelly roll pan. Bake for 30 minutes or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Cool completely. Make icing and spread on cake. Cut in squares and serve.
